I. Contest Label Form and Publicity Release Form: All entries must be accompanied by both a fully completed “Publicity Release Form.”

II. Contest Theme: The theme for the Essay Contest is to explain the importance of celebrating Veterans and Veterans Day. Each Essay Contest student, using his or her own words and creativity, will tell a personal story about how veterans have made an impact in their life, neighborhood, or town.

III. Contest Deadline: All essay entries must be received by September 25, 2020. The Grand Prize winners will be notified by October 28, 2020. Entries not meeting deadlines will be disqualified.

IV. Contest Grade Categories and Topics: The contests will be evaluated in the following grade-related categories.

<u>Grade Level</u>	<u>Word limits:</u>	<u>Topic:</u>	<u>Prize Offered:</u>
4th –6th	300 -500	Why do we celebrate Veterans Day?	\$50
7th –8th	400-700	Why do we honor Veterans?	\$75
9th -12th	500-1000	What does it mean to be a Veteran?	\$100

V. Essay Specifications: Essay entries can be electronically written (Word or Docs) or handwritten neatly on white 8½" X 11" lined paper and must be in English. All essays must be the work of only one (1) student, consisting of the student’s own words, thoughts, and creativity. Electronic submissions are accepted. Teachers may choose to scan all their entries per school to submit as one PDF. Note: Upon submission, all essays become the property of the Historical Society of Orange Park.

Eligibility: The contest is open to students in Grades 4-12 who are enrolled in public and private schools and home-schooled students living in Clay County.

VI. Judging: The decision of the adjudication panel is final. Each essay will be judged on the following criteria: Expression of the theme (50%) Content of writing (25%) Creativity of writing (25%).

VII. Awards: A group of 5 student finalists from each of the three grade categories will be awarded a certificate of merit. The winning student from each grade category will be presented with a special plaque and a check in the following values:

Due to Covid19, in lieu of a live event, the historical society is creating a video that will be shared with the community. First, second and third place winners in each grade category will be invited to be part of a recognition video. Students in each first-place grade level will be asked to be video-taped as they read their essays in front of the Magnolia Cemetery Veterans Memorial, 1040 Kingsley Avenue, Orange Park. Students will work with Mrs. Cheatwood, President of the Society (and an active Clay County teacher) to determine a time to tape the reading.
